The DomQuartier tour

The tour takes the visitor on a fascinating journey of discovery through Salzburg's impressive history, in the footsteps of the powerful prince-archbishops.

You will pass through splendidly decorated state-rooms and see valuable paintings in the Residenzgalerie, special exhibitions in the North Oratory of the Cathedral and ecclesiastical treasures in the Cathedral Museum. There are breathtaking views from the terrace on the Cathedral arcades, over the Residenz and Cathedral Squares, and from the organ loft in the Cathedral. You will visit the Cabinet of Curiosities and the Long Gallery of St Peter's, with its amazing architectural history.

Selected treasures from the comprehensive art collection of the Benedictine monastery are displayed in St Peter's Museum in the Wallistrakt [wing of the University]. Through the Kaisersaal and the Carabinierisaal you return to the starting-point, to the spirit of Prince-Archbishop Wolf Dietrich, who began, over 400 years ago, to transform Salzburg into a gem of the Baroque age.

The state-rooms and the Cathedral precinct also house important original musical venues. Archiepiscopal court musicians included Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, who composed music specifically for these premises and himself took part in performances here.

Salzburg – a centre of European musical culture 1587 – 1803

With court composers including W. A. Mozart, through 200 years of music history, in the original venues

DSalzburg's great musical tradition is inseparable from the history and the rooms of the Residenz and the Cathedral precinct.

This guided tour illustrates the highlights of this illustrious age, telling of grand spectacles organised for high-ranking guests, of exclusive concert performances and of musicians and composers who were an essential part of the festive events designed to enhance princely prestige.

Guided tour with musical accompaniment

An exciting journey of discovery through 200 years of Salzburg's musical history in the original venues.

An instrumental ensemble accompanies the tour, performing in selected places.

The *Da Ponte-Ensemble Salzburg* plays works by Heinrich Ignaz Franz Biber, Georg Muffat, Antonio Caldara, Leopold Mozart, W.A. Mozart, Michael Haydn, Luigi Gatti and others.

Austrian baroque landscapes

until 31 January 2022

Residenzgalerie Salzburg

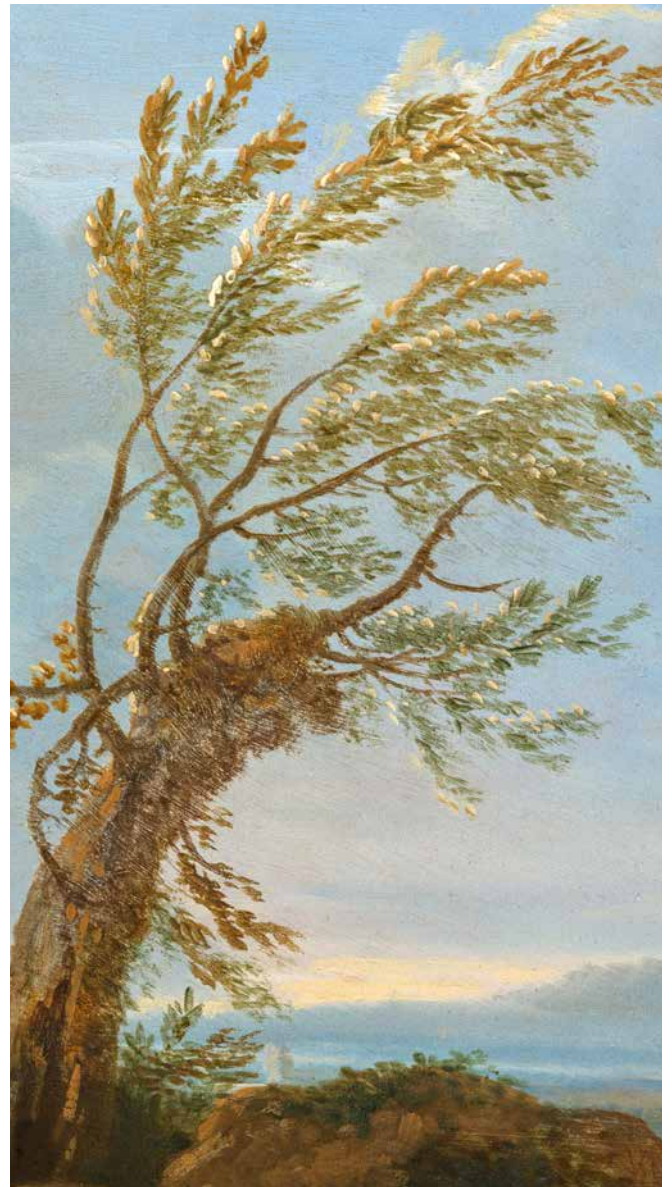
Nature as fine art. Landscape as motif.

The first comprehensive exhibition of Austrian baroque landscape in the Residenzgalerie.

Trees bowed by the wind, the play of colours through the leaves of forests bathed in light, the hazardous path over a mountain pass, an approaching storm, the hunting party resting in a secluded spot – Austrian baroque painters between 1600 and 1800 captured all this and much more on canvas, copper plates and wood panels. The formats ranged from postcard-sized cabinet pieces to canvases more than 2m wide. 18th-century collectors from aristocratic, ecclesiastical and bourgeois circles were great admirers of these diverse renderings.

Loans from long-standing partners and paintings from the Residenzgalerie collection invite the visitor to stroll among baroque landscapes.

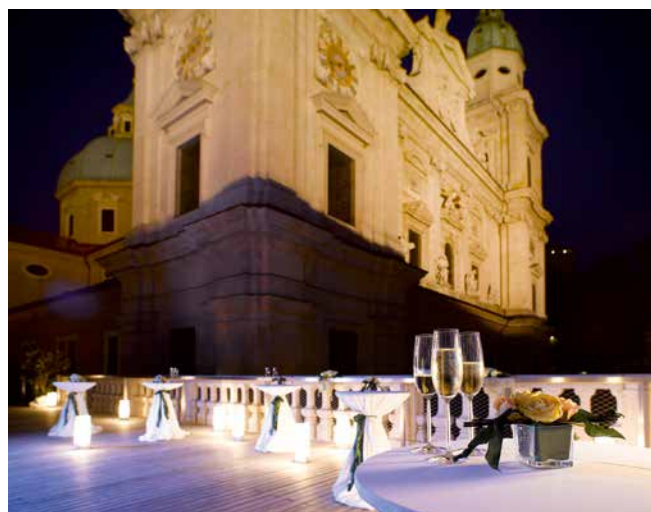
